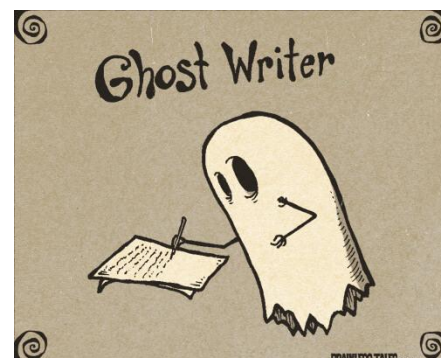
I was disheartened to have experienced a sister recently that only picks on another sister. Also, please remember, what happens at a meeting should not be coming out to the aerie social room.

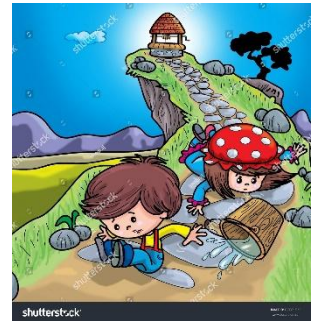

This program was held on March 28, 1971 at Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio and the awards were presented on May 3, 1971 at Fountain Square in Cincinnati at the Law Day Observance Program.

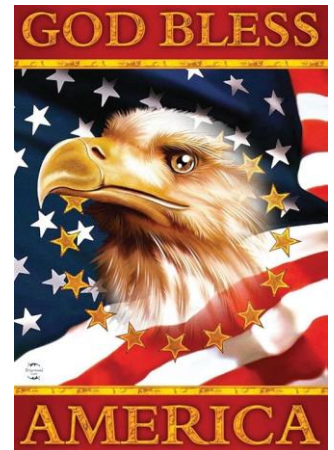
